## The White Grass Heritage Project Fund

We have been overwhelmed by the response to date and have been unable to transcribe and properly archive the existing oral history interviews due to the high volume of materials. Recognizing that more history is forthcoming, we are asking for assistance to make the White Grass Heritage Project materials readily accessible to researchers and the public through transcription and archiving.

The Jackson Hole Historical Society and Museum (JHSM), a partner of the White Grass Heritage Project since its inception, has created a dedicated fund to accept tax-deductible contributions for the White Grass Heritage Project. The Museum will use the fund to transcribe the approximately 70 hours of oral history interviews, archive the 2,700 plus historical photographs and accession them using the museum's Past-Perfect collections management software. The White Grass Heritage Project Collection will then be made available to the public through JHSM's Stan Klassen Research Center at 225 N. Cache in Jackson.
